

Mathematics

Children will:

- Count to thirty forwards and backwards from any given number.
- Count in tens forwards and backwards.
- Count, read and write numbers to 20 in numerals and words.
- Identify one more and one less than a given number.
- Use the language of equal to, more than, less than, fewer, most, least.
- Compare and order numbers to 20.
- Know number bonds to 10 and within 10.
- Add and subtract using single and 2 digit numbers.
- Use the vocabulary before and after to describe, sort and order events.
- Learn about the days of the week and the months of the year.
- Read the time to the hour on an analogue clock.
- Compare, describe and solve practical problems for time.
- Recognise, name and describe 2D and 3D shapes.
- Identify and continue simple patterns within 2D and 3D shapes.

Computing

Children will:

- Learn how to use Purple Mash.
- Become familiar with the types of resources available in the Topics section.
- Become more familiar with the icons used in the resources in the Topics section.
- Start to add pictures and text to work.

Science

Children will:

- Learn the names for the parts of the human body.
- Investigate and learn about the five senses.
- Learn about nocturnal animals.
- Learn about different habitats.
- Learn about carnivores and herbivores.

English

Children will:

- Read for pleasure and meaning and answer questions about books and stories read.
- Develop their pace, fluency and expression when reading aloud.
- Write character descriptions.

- Retell a story.
- Make an information leaflet about staying safe in the dark.

Phonics

Children will orally segment and blend the sounds in words through fun and interactive activities. Children will be working on Phase 4 in Letters and Sounds and learning the tricky words that are introduced in this phase. They will use their phonic knowledge and the tricky words they know to read and write words, captions and sentences. The children will be supported by Sign 4 Phonics which is an effective tool used throughout our school.

Geography

Children will:
